We gather and use certain information about individuals in order to provide information and services and to enable certain functions on this website.

We also collect information to better understand how visitors use the website and to present timely, relevant information to them.

What we gather

We may collect the following information:

- Name and role in organisation (where relevant)
- Contact information including email address
- Demographic information, such as postcode, and area of interest in relation to Big Ideas activities
- Website usage data
- Other information in relevant to user's enquiries
- Other information pertaining to community programmes and surveys

How we use this data

Collecting this data helps us understand what you are looking for from Big Ideas, enabling us to deliver targeted services and information.

Specifically, we may use data:

- For our own internal records.
- To improve the services and information we provide.
- To contact you in response to a specific enquiry.
- To send you emails about new programmes, services and other things we think might be relevant to you.
- To send you informational mailings or to call you about services and other things we think might be relevant to you.
- To contact you via email, telephone or mail for research reasons.

Cookies and how we use them

What is a cookie?

A cookie is a small file placed on your computer's hard drive. It enables our website to identify your computer as you view different pages on our website.

Cookies allow websites and applications to store your preferences in order to present content, options or functions that are specific to you. They also us to see information like how many people use the website and what pages they tend to visit.

How we use cookies

We may use cookies to:

- Analyse our web traffic using an analytics package. Aggregated usage data helps us improve our website structure, design, content and functions.
- Identify whether you are signed in to our website. A cookie allows us to check whether you are signed in to the site.
- Test content on our website.

- Store information about your preferences. The website can then present you with information you will find more relevant and interesting.
- To recognise when you return to our website. We may show your relevant content, or provide functionality you used previously.

Cookies do not provide us with access to your computer or any information about you, or provide functionality you used previously.

Controlling cookies

You can use your web browser's cookie settings to determine how our website uses cookies. If you do not want our website to store cookies on your computer or device, you should set your web browser to refuse cookies.
